

# COLLABORATION AGREEMENT RESPECTING THE APPORTIONING OF THE TASKS ASSIGNED TO THE SECRETARIATS OF MEXICO - BRAZIL - QUÉBEC AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF AN EXECUTIVE SECRETARIAT



## **EXECUTIVE SECRÉTARIAT**

The secretariat of Mexico will act in the capacity of Executive Secretariat of COPA. Under the responsibility of the President's office, this secretariat will also be assigned the following mandates:

- Coordinating the administrative activities of the three secretariats of COPA;
- Supporting the President's office in the accomplishment of its duties of representing COPA internationally;
- Providing follow-up to the decisions of the Executive Committee and the General Assembly;
- Preparing the minutes and reports of the Executive Committee and the General Assembly;
- · Preparing reports on the administration of the President's office;
- In collaboration with the treasurer, preparing and performing follow-up of the budget of COPA.



# THE SECRETARIATS OF THE PARLIAMENTARY CONFEDERATION OF THE AMERICAS

The COPA shall set up three secretariats located in Mexico, Brazil and Québec that will be given the following mandates:

### THE SECRETARIAT OF MEXICO

The secretariat of Mexico will also have the responsibility of the secretariat of two permanent thematic working committees and will develop and maintain communications with the parliamentarians and the parliamentary assemblies for whom it has been assigned the task of monitoring legislative and political information. In addition, it will be responsible for drafting the proceedings of COPA.

### THE SECRETARIAT OF BRAZIL

The secretariat of Brazil, consisting of the Chamber of Deputies of the National Congress of Brazil and the União Nacional dos Legislativos Estaduais - UNALE, will provide the organization with institutional support. This secretariat will have the responsibility of the secretariat of two permanent thematic working committees and will develop and maintain communications with the parliamentarians and the parliamentary assemblies for whom it has been assigned the task of monitoring legislative and political information. With Québec, it will be charged with creating content for and running the COPA Website. The secretariat of Brazil will be responsible for publishing and distributing COPA Magazine.

# THE SECRETARIAT OF QUÉBEC

The secretariat of Québec will offer the organization institutional support. It will have the responsibility of the secretariat of two permanent thematic working committees and will develop and maintain communications with the parliamentarians and the parliamentary assemblies for whom it has been assigned the task of monitoring legislative and political information. With Brazil, it will be charged with creating content for and running the COPA Website. The secretariat of Québec will be responsible for the Network of Women Parliamentarians of the Americas and the compilation and updating of the database. Finally, it will be charged with the translation of the official texts of COPA.

In witness whereof, on the occasion of the Executive Committee Meeting held in Mexico, we have agreed to collaborate on the implementation of the secretariats of Mexico, Brazil and Québec and on the implementation of an Executive Secretariat.
